Navigation without buttons

Some site on the net don't use buttons for site navigation. If you want to do this, here's how. Say your site has the following pages:
 index.htm
 about.htm
 contact.htm
 links.htm
 Add (under Extras) Visual HTML box. Click on grey circle next to custom-html. Add text as shown. The result is shown below

note text between the > and <a> appears as a hyperlink. Text after the <a> appears as ordinary text

If you are creating your favourite links by this method, it would be wise to make the links open up in a new browser page so that the user doesn't leave your site. The way to do this is: Open Visual HTML box. Click on circle next to custom-html. Add your favourite links as shown. This is very similar to the last example except you use absolute web addresses instead of ones relative to your site. Also, you will see that I have added "target=_blank" - this opens the link in a new browser page and I added "<p>" to the end of each line to force a new line for each link.
